

What does Supply and Demand look like for maize in SA?

EXPORTS OF WHITE MAIZE CAN CAUSE TIGHT CLOSING STOCK

Maize supply and demand overview:

White maize:

- The complete Supply & Demand is illustrated in **Table** 1, with the following noted:
- Looking at month-to-month consumption trends compared to the previous five years, less white maize was used for food.
- White maize exports have increased significantly, reason being that Southern Africa's imports have increased (See Graph 1) due to failed harvests in those countries.
- Currently white maize stock is very tight, although it is still sufficient for local consumption, the demand is eating into the pipeline stock.

Yellow Maize:

 There is a significant increase on a month-to-month basis, compared to the last five years, in animal and industrial use of yellow maize. Yellow maize is cheaper than white maize, therefore basically no white goes into animal consumption.

The free market's role in supply and demand:

The free market is of critical importance in the maize market in South Africa for several reasons. In a free market, prices are determined by supply and demand. This enables farmers and traders to determine the actual market value of maize. If there is a surplus of maize, prices fall, conversely, if there is a shortage, prices rise. From the trading of white and yellow maize prices, it is evident the free market is working.

Graph 1: White maize exports

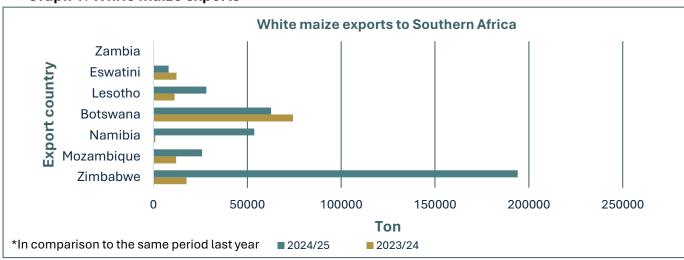
